In Years 4, 5 and 6, Pupil Premium children made better progress than non-Pupil Premium children.

The gaps were larger for Year 3 PP/Non Pupil Premium progress because there was a high number of children who were new to the country and it was a small cohort therefore each child counted for a larger percentage. There was high mobility for that cohort and a large proportion who started in Foundation Stage, had left by the end of KS1.
